NOTICE TO OWNERS OF PRIVATE WELLS IN THE VILLAGE OF ELLSWORTH

The Village of Ellsworth recently adopted a Well Abandonment Ordinance as required by Section NR 111.26 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code. The purpose of the ordinance is to protect the groundwater, including the aquifer supplying the Village with water, from contamination from unused, unsafe and non-complying private wells.

The well abandonment ordinance requires that the owner of a private well either obtain and complete an application for a well operation permit from the Village of Ellsworth, or abandon the well in accordance with NR 112 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code. If the owner does not take one of these actions before July 1, 1994, the Village will levy a fine against the well owner. Preparation of an application for a well operation permit will require the following information about the well and pump installation:

- 1. Verification that the well was constructed in accordance with NR112 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code.**
- 2. Verification that the well construction and pump installation have a history of producing bacteriologically safe water as evidenced by one sample taken annually.**
- 3. Verification that the well is not cross-connected to the municipal water supply system.**
- 4. A statement indicating the proposed use of the well and pump installation.**
